TREASURER'S REPORT

As of December 1, Treasurer Schultz shared that winter tax season has begun. She then gave a brief synopsis of the latest news regarding the LCEMS, highlighting grants received for educational programs.

CLERK'S REPORT

Clerk Daly updated board members and the public of the new changes coming up in elections because of Proposal 22-2 including: permanent consolidation of our two precincts into one, new ID cards being sent to residents affected by this change, post cards being made to notify our voters of early in-person voting, permanent ballot voters being mailed a party preference form for the presidential primary, and that cameras will be installed to monitor our ballot drop box and election room.

SUPERVISOR'S REPORT

Supervisor Monroe led a discussion about the results of the speed study in the downtown Hadley area. The speed data revealed the lowest, enforceable speed limits would be: 35-mph on the south end of town, and 45-mph for the other three directions. Destain Gingell, LCRC engineer gave his input, emphasizing that the 25-mph speed removal was no fault of the township board, and praised their proactive, persistent work to find the best solution for the situation. Gingell had suggestions for calming speeds headed into town, then encouraged residents to call the Lapeer County Road Commission's engineering department if they have questions about the speed study.

TRUSTEES' REPORT

Trustee Brandt told those attending that road projects are finished for the season.

Trustee Hartwig gave the board a synopsis of last month's planning meeting which highlighted: zoning ordinance draft review, Special Land Use sites, SLU for Copeman barn, and update of wind/solar ordinance to reflect state changes.

FIRE REPORT

Runs: 20 runs: (3 Fire; 19 EMS) Chief Nass thanked John Wallace for submitting Hadley Twp. Fire Department's name for Stanley Fasteners tool giveaway. HTFD received \$2,300 in DeWalt Tools. Chief Nass then said the Hadley Twp. Historical society gave the HTFD an award for the department's support of the historical society. He added the Shop with a Hero program helped a Hadley family that recently lost their house to a fire. Chief Nass thanked the Hadley Lions Club for contributing extra funds in addition to HTFD's contribution.

PUBLIC TIME

County Commissioner Knisely said there wasn't much new to report from the county, but said the following: 2024 budget is official, there will be ARPA fund improvements to historic county buildings, and approval of county road patrol contracts. Residents discussed the following: M-24 project status, voter registration concerns,

NEW BUSINESS

The owner of the dangerous building on Diehl Rd. signed a contract for its demolition. Therefore, no action is needed on the township's part.

PUBLIC TIME

Residents discussed the following items: Senior programs available to county residents, Merry Christmas, thank you to Dave and Tom Tunison, Scott Bryant, and Joe O'Brien for hanging the Christmas tree lights and mill bridge lights.
